How Will You Know When It Is Your Turn to Get theCOVID-19 Vaccine?



Governor Andrew M. Cuomo today announced the NYS Department of Health has released a draft COVID-19 Vaccination Administration Program that serves as an initial framework for ensuring the safe and effective distribution of a COVID-19 vaccine in New York.

Individuals over 65 and Individuals under 65 with high-risk, will be in Phase 2 or 3. At this point, it is unclear who will be notifying you. UR Medicine has been selected to manage the vaccines in our area, and recent notices state if you are a URMC patient, you will be notified by them about the vaccine. Because this is a huge undertaking, expect changes to schedules, and notifications as situations develop and vaccines become more readily available.

I reached out to Jennifer Rodriquez of the Livingston County Public Heath Dept., and she informed me that in March they will be holding vaccination clinics as well, but had little information for us.

It is your choice to be vaccinated, and you should talk with your family and medical professional to help you with the decision.

Ever wonder why your breaker trips in certain areas. This occurs for the following reason.

• You do not have a surge protector with an EMI filter.

You should not be using regular extension cords, as this will also trip your breaker. Also, old appliances, and electrical items can also cause issues. If you are ever in doubt, please ask me.

It is nice to see the way some of you have decorated your little nook near your apartment door. A couple of things to be mindful of.

- 1. We are unable to vacuum the space where your decorations are, and request that you please be sure to vacuum.
- 2. Some decorated areas are protruding into the hallway, and we ask that you scale them back so they are not protruding.
- 3. Any decorations you put on the wall must be done with 3M removable hooks so as to avoid damage to the walls.
